Welcome

September marked the beginning of Success4All's 11th year and with it we have seen some changes!



We have opened a 7th Learning Hub at the Scotswood Centre in the West End of Newcastle. The Hub, which is kitted out with comfy sofas and bean bags, runs every Tuesday and Thursday, 4:30 – 6pm.

However, we also had to say some goodbyes. Sadly, the Millin Centre, where our first ever Learning Hub was based in 2006, has closed down. Due to this, we have moved our Millin Centre and Newcastle Skills Centre Hub to the Carnegie Building on Atkinson Road in

Benwell, where Success4All's first ever offices are now based! We now cater for both Primary and Secondary tutees in one place on a Monday and Wednesday at our Carnegie Hub, 4:30 – 6pm, and Millin's Saturday's sessions have literally moved down the road to Farndale Road.

LEARNING HUBS

This year we have 7 Learning Hubs running with access to 15 sessions every week. Over this term, we have supported a total number of 221 learners that have registered with us. The young people have visited a total of 1146 times over the course of this term, at an average of 95.5 times per week. This year we have had a total of **48** one to one tuition contracts in subjects including English as a second language, Maths, English, French, German and Chinese.

31 volunteers have returned this year and 84 newbies have come on board, totally an enormous support from 115 volunteers. This term they have supported the tutees 617 visits at an average of 55.8 times per week.



Our Learning Hubs

Millin Centre

This term our highest number of one to one contracts were at the Millin Centre Hub.

'Last week I got 49/50 on my Maths tests. Coming to the Learning Hub helps me with my Maths and I like coming because it helps me with my school work.' (Tutee)

'I love coming to homework Club. My tutor always helps me no matter what and I have access to computers to expand on what I learn.' (Tutee).

Scotswood

Scotswood is our newest Learning Hub in partnership with the Scotswood Centre on Armstrong Road. In only 2 months 14 children and young people are now registered and attend on a regular basis.

'It has been rewarding to see the progress of two French sisters who have just moved to England. Starting with phonics, they have now successfully completed Success4All's beginner English as an additional language package and have moved on to the intermediate booklet. I can't wait to see where they are at next term.' (Tutor)

Skills Centre

Our Wingrove Hub has been doing exceptionally well this term. So well in fact that we are starting a second session at Wingrove that will run on a Wednesday, 4:30 – 6pm in order to cater for the waiting list that has formed!



Walker Technology College



CODE CLUBS

This year thanks our sponsor the Reece Foundation, we have continued to run four Code Clubs across Newcastle, in Blakelaw, Throckley, Wingrove and Walker (where the club is now based at Walker Technology College).

The help of our 6 fantastic Code Club volunteers who help us run these clubs mean that on average 23 children a week have been available to develop their IT skills!



George, our Code Club Leader at our Throckley Learning Hub says that "It's impressive how quickly the kids learn. Most have done some coding at school, but Code Club gives them the chance to improve upon their skills and become more able to solve problems using code."



BROADY'S YOUTH CAFÉ

This term has seen two students from Walker Technology College (one in year 8 and one in year 10) volunteer to manage an after-school café every Wednesday! The Year 10 student thought of the idea for the café after they took part in a project with Business Sparks who came to our Learning Hubs to support the children and young people with their business ideas.



The Café is an excellent opportunity for children to relax and socialise over something to eat and drink following the school's early finish every Wednesday. Broady's is perfect for those who have just moved to the area and are settling in, and is also great for other students to wind down with a delicious cheese toastie after a hard day of school.

The Café will be open every Wednesday between 4pm and 6pm and runs alongside our Walker Code Club.



Business Sparks

WEYDA- EUROSOLE TRIP

This term saw an exciting trip take place for our WEYDA (West End Young Digital Artists) Club. Through their partnership with EUROSOLE, a team of Club members and project leaders flew out to Dublin on the 23rd October to take part in the first venture with the European learning project. The 4-day trip brought together young people from countries like England, Ireland, Finland and Belgium who are all part of the EUROSOLE project. It allowed them to share their experiences of solving big questions and take part in joint activities that tested their teamwork skills.



WEYDA's trip to Dublin encouraged them to learn new subjects and skills for themselves. On the first day they took part in ice breaker activities and established a collaborative community ethos.

The Tuesday saw them focus on selfreflection by getting them to lead SOLE, using tools they'd learnt. Before returning to Newcastle on the Wednesday, the group used self-evaluation to take part in practical team working tasks. The trip was one of our best successes this term as our best successes this term as our young people gained skills in working collaboratively with likeminded people of different nationalities. Dublin marked the first of many opportunities with EUROSOLE, such as trips to Belgium and Finland that will appear in newsletters to come!



THE BUG HOTEL

Over the May half-term our children kept themselves busy by creating a Bug Hotel in the Life Transformation Church's garden!

Using funding from the Elswick First Community Trust the children researched and planted flowers that would attract bees and butterflies, before building the hotel from recycled wood.



Their aim was to create a safe and welcoming environment, perfect for bugs, bees, birds and hedgehogs. Over the summer and next year, they want to create a wildlife sanctuary that the local wildlife can call a home, this includes making bird and hedgehog houses to add to the bug hotel.
