How we use your child's and your information

The categories of information that we collect, hold and share include:

- Personal information (such as name, school, GP details and home address etc)
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended and number of absences)
- Assessment information
- Information relevant to the welfare of your child's needs eg. Medical information, SEN information, behavioural needs.

Why we collect and use this information

We use your child's data:

- to support your child's learning
- to assess the quality of our services to safeguard children and young people
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing

The lawful basis on which we use this information

We collect and use children and young people's information where legislation (including the General Data Protection Regulation or 'GDPR') requires or allows us to do so (Article 6 GDPR) or, in the case of special category data within the meaning of GDPR, where this is (for example) necessary for reasons of substantial public interest (Article 9 GDPR).

Storing yours and your child's data

Why we share information

We do not share information about those registered with us to anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, parents, children and young people have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, please contact Busola Afolabi, (see details below)*

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
